Focus on Attendance

Road to 95% attendance

We believe that children cannot learn if they are absent from school. Therefore we aim to ensure that all our young people take full advantage of the educational opportunities available to them at Batchwood School. We strive to provide a welcoming and caring environment in which our young people can learn and thrive, and to work with our families to ensure regular, punctual attendance. Parents and carers are responsible by law for ensuring their children regularly attend school. The attendance officer, form tutors, wellbeing team and the head teacher are all available to support families struggling with attendance. Please be aware that if parents do not proactively engage with the support offered by school, or a student has at least 15 sessions of unauthorised absence in a term (there are two sessions in each school day) the school will consider applying for a penalty notice to be served. Together we can move towards our goal of 95% attendance across the school.

Illness

The weather has certainly turned and has brought with it the usual round of winter illnesses. As a parent it can be difficult deciding whether your child is well enough to attend school. Whilst we would not want you to send a very poorly child into school, it is fine to send them in with a low level cough or cold. Dealing with a school day whilst feeling under the weather is an important life skill and helps build resilience for future experiences. As always, we will ensure your child can access extra support on these days. Please be aware that it is a parent or guardian's legal requirement to ensure their child attends school. Failure to do so can result in a penalty or legal action.

This half terms team building House Competition was based on a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Maths) activity.


