Provider Access Policy

Introduction

This policy statement outlines the school's arrangements for managing the access of education and training providers to the school, for the purpose of informing pupils about approved technical education qualifications and apprenticeships. This policy complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 (as inserted by the Technical and Further Education Act 2017).

Pupil Entitlement (Years 8-13)

All pupils in years 8 to 13 are entitled to:

- Information on Technical Education and Apprenticeships: Receive comprehensive information about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities as part of a structured careers programme that details the full range of educational and training options at each key transition point.
- **Direct Provider Encounters:** Engage with a diverse range of local providers to learn about their offerings, including technical education and apprenticeships, through events such as options evenings, assemblies, group discussions, and taster sessions.
- Application Guidance: Understand the application processes for all academic and technical courses.

Mandatory Provider Encounters (Years 8-11)

In compliance with the Provider Access Legislation, pupils of compulsory school age (Years 8-11) will participate in a minimum of four meaningful provider encounters: two encounters for pupils in years 8 and 9, and two encounters for pupils in years 10 and 11.

These encounters will occur during regular school hours, ensuring all pupils have equitable access.

Meaningful Provider Encounter Requirements

Each provider encounter will, at a minimum, enable pupils to:

- Receive Provider and Qualification Information: Obtain detailed information about the
 provider and the approved technical education qualifications and apprenticeships they offer.
- **Understand Career Pathways:** Explore potential career routes associated with these educational and training options.
- **Gain Provider Insights:** Develop an understanding of the learning or training experience with the provider, including opportunities to interact with provider staff and current learners.
- **Engage in Question and Answer Sessions:** Have the opportunity to ask questions and receive clear, informative answers.

Definition of a Meaningful Encounter

A meaningful encounter is defined as a structured meeting or session between pupils and a provider that adheres to the criteria outlined above.

The school is committed to ensuring all provider encounters are conducted in a meaningful way, utilising the "Making it Meaningful" checklist as a guide.

Opportunities for Provider Access

The school will facilitate the four mandatory provider encounters required by law, in addition to incorporating further provider interactions into the school's comprehensive careers programme.

Opportunities will be provided for providers to engage with pupils and/or their parents/carers.

Providers are encouraged to contact the Careers Leader to discuss and identify the most suitable opportunities for their engagement.

Premises and Facilities

The school will provide appropriate facilities for provider engagements, including, but not limited to, the main hall, classrooms, or conference rooms, as determined by the nature of the activity. Audiovisual and other specialised equipment will be made available to support provider presentations. Specific requirements will be discussed and agreed upon in advance with the Careers Leader or a designated member of the careers team.

Recognising the evolving landscape of educational engagement, the school also supports meaningful online interactions. Providers capable of delivering engaging live online sessions are encouraged to propose such formats.

Providers are welcome to supply copies of prospectuses or other relevant course literature for distribution or inclusion in the Careers Resource Centre, which is managed by Mrs McCabe, Head of English.
